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


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Set to Flourish in a New Location

The Heart of the City

Psychology

The Psychology program offers many BA degree options to suit your needs. Our highly focused and specialized 3-year Community Mental Health program is a streamlined set of courses allowing you to learn critical counselling and intervention skills. Our 4-year degree provides you with a wider breadth of knowledge, and you can specialize further by taking our Applied Psychology or Honours program.

A Bachelor of Arts in Psychology studies the human mind and behaviour, and is unique in many exciting ways. Our class sizes are small creating a close-knit community of learners. You will have the opportunity to form meaningful connections with your professors, allowing them to support you in your coursework and beyond. We also provide a robust internship program, where you can gain hands-on experience working in agencies and institutions across Winnipeg. In fact, many students end up with employment in the same places they completed internships.

This degree sets you up for a meaningful, fulfilling career in a diverse range of fields. You will graduate with the skills to go out into the world and help others in areas such as personnel, labour relations, social services, health services, mental health, correctional service, and so much more. You will be able to work directly with people to provide them with the support they need.



The Community and Urban Transformation (CUT) program at Booth UC provides you with the opportunity to analyze cities, urbanization, and the transformational experiences of urban life through a variety of disciplinary lenses in order to promote just, sustainable, and flourishing urban communities. Along with Booth UC's core curriculum, CUT course content touches on issues specific to Winnipeg, Canada such as youth, poverty and homelessness, and the Indigenous experience. It also extends to global issues like international development and human rights.

You will become equipped with the techniques and strategies to address urban social issues by learning in community, building intercultural knowledge, and gaining conflict transformation skills, and by pursuing leadership development, spiritual formation, and vocational discernment. You will graduate with the skills to go out into the world and transform your community.

Community and Urban Transformation

The CUT major leads to a 4-year BA, while its minor study complements other programs at Booth UC. Courses cover a range of relevant issues and topics informed by and geared towards self-transformation in the urban context.

"The CUT program emphasizes a transformational approach. Not only are we encouraging students to study and experience cities, to understand issues like poverty and health, we want them to be able to contribute some kind of change. Behavioural Sciences

The Behavioural Sciences program offers 3- and 4-year BA degree options to meet your personalized needs. You can also include a minor such as English or Film Studies to support your knowledge of human cultures and societies through the lens of literature or film media.

"I plan to use my BA in Behavioural Sciences to help children in my country. I hope to use innovative methods to assist students with developmental disabilities to achieve their educational goals. In The Bahamas, many disabled children struggle due to a lack of emphasis, funding, and availability of qualified specialists. I want to become an advocate for them and help them succeed in school."

Behavioural Sciences is an interdisciplinary program that combines perspectives from psychology and sociology to understand human behaviour and help people thrive at the individual and community levels. Our program is highly integrated, with our psychology and sociology professors working together closely in teaching and research. One thing that makes this program unique is our internship opportunities. You will gain hands-on experience working with agencies and institutions across Winnipeg.

This degree sets you up for a meaningful, fulfilling career, especially in the social services. Your education will allow you to help those struggling with poverty, substance use, and mental health concerns in areas such as urban studies, criminal justice, research, community development, advocacy, environmental issues, and counseling. You will be able to work directly with people to provide them with the support they need.



Students of religion at Booth UC are introduced to key facets of Christianity (scripture, history, theology, practices) and other fascinating religions around the world. Our campus community welcomes people from all backgrounds, encourages diverse perspectives, and nurtures rich friendships. You will not only examine the human condition but also discover religious solutions to pressing human and global problems. You will come to appreciate the diversity, depth, and dynamism of religion.

After completing a BA in Religion, many of our graduates pursue careers in church ministry, teaching, not-for-profit administration, and social services. Some graduates also go on to earn advanced degrees in religious studies and related disciplines.

Religion

The Religion program offers a number of learning pathways. Students can enroll in the Certificate of Christian Studies, which takes one year of full-time study to complete. For those who wish to pursue a BA degree, there is a 3-year or 4-year option.

English and Film Studies

Students entering the English and Film Studies program can choose to pursue a 3-year or 4-year Bachelor of Arts. Along with the core subjects required of all students, English majors can expect to take courses focusing on British, American, and Canadian literature, as well as other texts written in English.

To study English and film is to study people's stories, which ultimately helps us understand what our society values most at any given time. Through rigorous scholarship and interactive courses, you will be encouraged to engage with and think critically about voices and experiences that have the potential to change the way you see and interact with the world.

Our program stands out as being the only one in Winnipeg working towards offering practical opportunities to learn beyond school walls. By offering you the chance to put your degree to work, we seek to integrate public scholarship into academia and to foster experiential learning and an exchange of knowledge in the arts.

Graduates with a BA in English and Film are excellent communicators who thrive in fields such as education, publishing, filmmaking and criticism, non-profit work, government and policy work, activism, and any other form of work that facilitates social change.



Interdisciplinary Studies is an open and flexible degree program where students combine subjects from two different disciplines, rather than majoring in just one. Like its students, no two courses of study will be the same. What makes it unique is the combination of diverse courses that cover many disciplines, critical thinking, and hands-on learning. For example, a pre-law student with an interest in immigrant & refugee studies could combine psychology and sociology and focus their assignments and experiential learning component on working with that population.

As an Interdisciplinary Studies student, you will learn how to think critically about intricate, interconnected concepts and articulate an informed view of the world with an awareness for its complexity and diversity, and to do so with an appreciation for the Christian world view and a multidisciplinary perspective.

Interdisciplinary Studies

With guidance from an advisor, this program allows independent-minded students the flexibility to create and shape a program of study that aligns with their post graduate goals and job interests. You can choose to pursue either a 3-year or 4-year BA degree.

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Bachelor of Business Administration

The BBA is a 3-year or 4-year program. In addition to the broad education of the liberal arts core, the BBA teaches the knowledge and skills for successful entry into business in either for-profit or not-for-profit organizations.

Given today's complex business world, there is a strong demand for skilled, knowledgeable, ethical, and engaged global business professionals. To meet this demand, and to prepare you to make a meaningful difference in the world, Booth UC's School of Business offers a unique, relevant and flexible Business Administration degree. The program focuses on establishing competence in five basic areas of business, while also providing scope to deepen expertise in one or more of these areas: accounting and finance, human resource management, marketing, organizational behaviour, and production operations.

Booth UC also offers a degree completion program in partnership with RRC Polytech. Students who complete a two year Diploma in Business Administration at RRC Polytech can earn a BBA after two years at Booth UC.



Our Social Work program prepares students to facilitate change in individuals, families, groups, organizations and communities, and is grounded in the realities of practice. A unique aspect of our program is small class sizes that allow students to complete learning activities that are more advanced. This means your instructors are able to take more time to construct and evaluate your activities. During the course of your studies, you will gain hundreds of hours of practical experience in the field. You will also benefit from the unique way we match students for practicum placement.

Graduates of the Social Work program have been able to work as registered social workers in Manitoba and beyond. We are an approved program of the Manitoba College of Social Workers (MCSW) for registration in the province of Manitoba. BSW graduates who register with the MCSW are eligible to take the Association of Social Work Boards (ASWB) licensing examination.

Bachelor of Social Work

Our BSW is available in a 4-year program and a 2-year after-degree program. With this degree, you will be ready to take on diverse roles in a wide variety of settings and help persons affected by issues such as addictions, mental health concerns, unemployment, and poverty.

Associate of Business Administration Degree

This 2-year degree will provide you with a foundation in key areas of business, in combination with a liberal arts background. If you are looking for the knowledge and skills to help you gain entry into the for-profit or non-profit sectors, then this degree may be for you. Also, if you are looking for experience to assist with starting your own business, then it is a good option. Upon graduating, you may also continue on to complete your Bachelor of Business Administration degree.

Associate of Arts Degree



Covering topics such as English, religion, and social sciences, it will help you develop critical thinking and writing skills. Upon graduating, you may also continue on to complete a Bachelor of Arts, Bachelor of Business Administration or Bachelor of Social Work degree.

Experiential Learning

INTERNSHIPS: Psychology and Behavioural Sciences students are placed with organizations that work in areas such as community mental health, supportive counselling, and newcomer and refugee services. You are mentored and supported by an expert in the field, and Booth UC faculty, to expand your knowledge and skills. FIELD PLACEMENTS: As a Social Work student, you will gain hundreds of hours working in field placements to better prepare you for a career as a Social Worker. You will also benefit from the unique way we match our students for practicum placement and have our core faculty established as the ones who serve as liaisons for all placements.

URBAN SERVICE LEARNING

(USL): As a core requirement, all other Booth UC students take part in service learning. Focusing on social concerns, you'll step out of the classroom into the heart of Winnipeg where you will learn about the root causes of injustice while gaining valuable work and life experience.
