Searching ATLA Religion

ATLA lets you search for articles and essays on aspects of Religion and Bible study, including by scripture passage. This guide will give you a quick overview of the search page, the results list and options for how to save, request, and cite these sources for your research.

Search Mode: Choose 'Find all my search terms' for keyword searching. Choose 'Boolean/Phrase' for more focused results

Scripture Search: Click here to search by scripture passage

Database Name: Click on the databases to search more than one at a time. This may increase the number of results you get.

Filter: Click on the Filter tab to narrow your results to **peer reviewed** sources, or by **date** or other limiters.

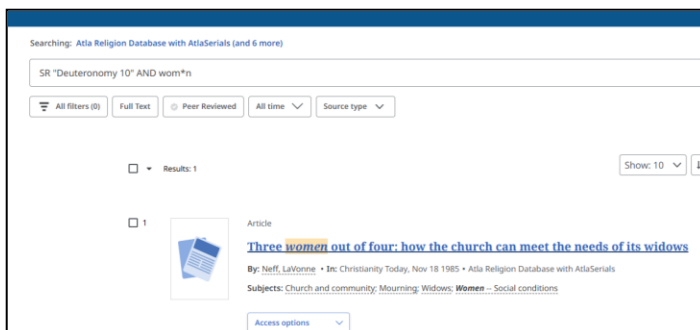
Scripture Search



1. From the search or results page, click **“Atla Scripture Search,”** located under the Research Tools on the left side of the page.
2. Browse through the books of the Bible until you find the one you want
 - a. If you want to search the entire chapter, click in the box in front of the book name and go to step 4
3. Click on the + icon beside the Book name to narrow to a particular chapter
 - a. If you want to search the entire chapter, click in the box in front of the chapter number.
 - b. If you are searching only a set of verses, click on the + and check the box in front of the first verse in the section
4. Scroll up the page and click on **Add to Search** just above the scripture list



You can add Keywords to the resulting search to narrow your search even further.



For example: The screenshot below shows a search in Deuteronomy 10 and the keyword “wom*n” added after it to find only articles about women in that chapter.
