

SESSIONAL INSTRUCTOR – Personal Support Worker Certificate Program

Booth University College's School for Continuing Studies (Personal Support Worker Certificate Program) is seeking a part-time Sessional instructor who will teach the following course:

- PSW007 Rehabilitative and Restorative Care [6 weeks; Online ; (Asynchronous)]

The Personal Support Worker Certificate program at Booth UC has been developed in accordance with the Ontario Personal Support Worker Standard (2022) and is endorsed by the Canadian Association of Support Workers (CANSWA) and the Ontario Personal Support Worker Association (OPSWA).

Responsibilities

Sessional Instructors in the Personal Support Worker Certificate Program are responsible to guide student progress through course curriculum that has been designed to cover 14 different topic areas. Courses are offered in a flexible online asynchronous delivery mode, enabling learners to fit their education with other personal life commitments. The courses range in length from 6 weeks (3 credit hours), 4 weeks (2 credit hours), to 2 weeks (1 credit hour).

Specifically, a Sessional Instructor is responsible to:

- Introduce themselves and the course to enrolled students
- Facilitate topical discussions as required by curriculum
- Provide timely responses to student questions related to course material and assignments
- Evaluate student performance on assignments and tests
- Upload student grades to the Student Information System

Qualifications:

1. Required

- Registered Nurse degree or other allied health degree (LPN, HCA, RSW, etc) with minimum of 5 years work experience
- Experience working in long term care or home health care settings
- Experience teaching adult learners
- Satisfactory criminal record check;
- Fully supportive of the integration of faith and learning in a Christian university setting and a commitment to the Mission of Booth University College;
- Must be legally entitled to work in Canada

2. Assets (Preferred Qualifications)

- Experience teaching Health Care Aide or Personal Support Worker curriculum
